



Cascina

Located on the right bank of the Arno and near the foothills of the **Monti Pisani**, Cascina is a commercial and manufacturing center of great importance to the flourishing furniture industry that has gone over time in addition to agriculture.

In the villages, especially near the road Firenze-Pisa-Livorno, some very good accommodation, shopping malls and department stores. The population of **Navacchio, Farm** hosts **a Scientific and Technological**

Excellence, an important reference point for the development and innovation of small and medium enterprises.

Ancient fortified **town**, before then, especially agricultural trade to its strategic location on the connecting road between Florence and the ancient port of Pisa, since the end of the 800 House has grown rapidly as a center for woodworking, so much so that today considered a capital of Italian furniture.

Laboratories and **furniture** scattered throughout the town and its surroundings and the presence of an Art Institute with a specialization in the art of wood, giving the feeling of lively activities in the field of handicraft and furniture.

The Permanent Exhibition of Furniture, established in 1922 in the seat of the Workers' Society, hosts the **Museum of Arts and Crafts of Wood**

collecting objects, tools and machines used in laboratories and workshops with the aim of promoting the history and enhance the value associated with the tradition of craftsmanship and wood.

Among the many traces of the medieval history of the town, to see the **church of Santa Maria Assunta and San Giovanni**, around which developed the first urban center, and the thirteenth-century city wall, still partially preserved even with following reconstruction. Among the many events that take place periodically remind the traditional Mercantico, held the first Sunday of each month from October to June, during which you can admire antiques and local crafts.
